Curtain rises for an extraordinary World Cup edition in Val Gardena/Gröden

Even if the grandstands around the finish course of the Saslong remain empty and the VIP tent at the two speed classics in Val Gardena/Gröden will be searched for in vain this year - these circumstances will not dampen the anticipation of a top-class sporting event. The organizers around OC president Rainer Senoner are first and foremost happy that races can be held at all on one of the world's most renowned downhill courses. The efforts in the run-up to the 53rd Saslong Classic were consequently great.



Skiing has become more and more professional over the past decades. And it has become equally complex to organize a World Cup event. It is a challenge that all organizers now deal with 365 days a year. When the last participant crosses the finish line at a World Cup venue and the award

ceremony is over, preparations for the following year usually begin. There are plans to be drawn up, contracts with suppliers and partners to be negotiated, orders to be monitored, employees to be trained and much more. After the event is before the event.

But in 2020 everything was and is different. The coronavirus took over the world in February. Nothing is the way it was before. Overnight, everything changed. At the end of the 2019/20 season, the coronavirus also impacted the world of skiing. The World Cup had to be cancelled prematurely, the planned final in Cortina - which would have been the World Championship dress rehearsal at the same time - did not take place. And the preparations for the 53rd Saslong Classic also came to a halt. How will things continue? Under what conditions will there be races in Val Gardena/Gröden?



Will the World Cup take place at all? These were the questions that Rainer Senoner and his team posed themselves in the spring.

Being prepared for all scenarios

But the Saslong Classic Club reacted quickly - and professionally, as usual. The board and the Organizing Committee immediately developed several scenarios. Already at the end of May - when the International Ski Federation FIS confirmed the World Cup calendar 2020/21 - the team



sensed that they would have to be very flexible in the upcoming season. "In the best case scenario, we will go through the races as usual. However, we will also be prepared if the number of spectators is limited or if we can't hold the races in front of an audience at all," said Rainer Senoner at the time.

And that is what happened. While the Organizing Committee was still optimistic in the summer that it would be able to hold the races with a reduced number of spectators, the first doubts came in early autumn after infection numbers started to rise in all parts of Europe. In October, in agreement with FIS, the Italian Winter Sports Federation FISI, the state government and the local health authorities, it was decided that the speed classics would be held at the 1970 World Cup venue in front of empty stands.

Great support - also among the population

The decision was unavoidable and made not only by the Saslong Classic Club but supported by all stakeholders. Above all, the tourism industry and the political decision makers in Val Gardena/Gröden - along with the South Tyrolean provincial government and all partners - were behind holding the legendary races under the Sassolungo/Langkofel mountain. "This cohesion and lived solidarity are an essential driving force for the Saslong Classic Club. Despite the coronavirus



pandemic, which is putting many obstacles in our path, we hope that the 2020 World Cup will be an international event full of passion for skiing", Rainer Senoner is enthusiastic about the great support he also feels from the local population.

And so, on the last weekend before Christmas, all ski fans will be able to enjoy the two classics on the Saslong. The audience won't be on-site, but joining in front of the TV screens from millions of homes. The organizers will provide the fans with real-time available news and exciting background information on social media and the official website www.saslong.org. "If the fans are not allowed to come to the Saslong, then this year the World Cup will come all the more to the fans," promises Senoner.

Who shines from the winner's podium?



In the run-up to the 53rd Saslong Classic, there is no clear answer to the question of who is among the contenders for victory in the South Tyrolean Speed Classics. The last races of the past season were too long ago and the downhill stars are only racing once in Val d'Isère, France, before the showdown in the valley. But it is no secret that

the Saslong is a course well suited for Norwegians. Every year from 2012 to 2018, one athlete from Norway dominated at least one of the two speed competitions.

The data of the most recent Val Gardena/Gröden races supports this claim: nine of the last 15 competitions ended with a victory for Kjetil, Jansrud & Co., and the Vikings even triumphed in six of the last eight super-G races. In 2016, the Norwegians made a special appearance when they swept the podium in the super-G - a result that had previously only been accomplished by the skiing nation Austria in 2004. Incidentally, one Austrian was also on the top step of the podium last year in the Super-G: Vincent Kriechmayr celebrated the fifth World Cup victory of his career on the Saslong. Do



you think the Austrian will possibly repeat his prowess this year? Or can Dominik Paris bring home his third South Tyrolean triumph in his comeback season? Questions to which there will be an answer on December 18 and 19 at an extraordinary World Cup edition in Val Gardena/Gröden.





Vincent Kriechmayr: "Val Gardena/Gröden is one of the absolute highlights"

Last year, Vincent Kriechmayr added a new name to the long list of winners in Val Gardena/Gröden. The 29-year-old Austrian won with a five hundredths of a second lead over Kjetil Jansrud. In a race that, after several weather-related interruptions, lasted for what felt like an eternity. Kriechmayr raced the entire 2019/20 winter at a very high level, impressively demonstrated by his fifth place in the overall World Cup and second place in the super-G classification. In the following interview, the Austrian downhill star talks about his special relationship with Val Gardena/Gröden, his goals for the World Cup winter 20/21 and he also shares his very clear opinion about how Dominik Paris will return after his injury is over.

Question: Vincent Kriechmayr, last year you had to wait a long time after an extremely crazy race until your first victory on the Saslong was certain. With which feelings do you return to Val Gardena/Gröden?

Vincent Kriechmayr: I always like to return to Val Gardena/Groden, not only because of my first victory on the Saslong. I feel very comfortable in the valley.

How important is this success in one of the oldest "classics" of the ski circuit for you personally?

Of course of a very high value. Val Gardena/Gröden, with Wengen and Kitzbühel, is one of the absolute highlights every year.

Pirmin Zurbriggen, Lasse Kjus, Michael Walchhofer and Aksel Lund Svindal are the four racers who won super-G and downhill on the Saslong. Will the name Vincent Kriechmayr be added on December 19, 2020 with a triumph in the downhill?

The four athletes you have just named are among the absolute legends in the history of skiing. To create this outstanding achievement would be incredible. However, the competition is, as every year, incredibly strong. Nevertheless, I will certainly try everything.



Since your super-G victory on the Saslong, world events have been radically changed by the coronavirus pandemic. How have you experienced this situation?

I was not significantly restricted in my summer training. However, like the majority of the population, I was reminded once again what the really important things in life are.

How did the preparation for the season go? Did you have to change a lot - due to the restrictions?

No, not really. Only the overseas training in South America was understandably not possible due to the situation.

In the super-G classification, you finished second in each of the last three seasons. At the end of last winter, you were only three points behind Mauro Caviezel. Does that still bother you a bit?

No, because Mauro was simply three points better in the six super-G races until the end of the season.

Is it enough this year to be at the top?

I'm not worried about that.



What other goals have you set yourself for the upcoming season?

I want to improve everywhere, be it in skiing technique, material and conditioning ... just to name a few examples.

You have a lot of precious metal to defend at the World Championships in Cortina. After all, you came back from Åre with silver in the super-G and bronze in the downhill...

Yes, that's right. As always, the World Championships are a big event and it's all about getting the performance on that day right.

While Cortina hopes to host the World Championships with an audience, most of the World Cup races in the 2020/21 season will be held without spectators. Will you miss the support of the fans?

Of course the support of the fans is missing. The fans are extremely important in our sport. Not because we might not ski as well without fans, but because it makes our sport even better when you can celebrate success in front of fans and with fans.

Who do you think is the favorite to win in the fast disciplines this winter?

As every year, the usual names will be in the front. Paris, Feuz, Mayer, Caviezel, Dreßen, Kilde, Clarey etc.

And who are the favorites to win the overall World Cup?

Not much will change from last year. Those who were also among the front runners last year.

Finally, a question that should be of great interest to all South Tyrolean fans: How strong do you think Dominik Paris will be in his comeback season?

Very, very strong. I think "Domme" will return just as strong as he was before his injury.

There are 25 "special" fans In Val Gardena/Gröden

Due to this year's special circumstances, the majority of the World Cup events in the various winter sports disciplines in 2020/21 will take place without attending spectators. Nevertheless, 25 "special" fans will be present in the finish stadium of the Saslong on the last weekend before Christmas - made possible by a cooperation with Unika, the Val Gardena/Gröden platform for sculpture, painting and photography

The creation of wood-carved figures is a century old tradition in Val Gardena. What had started as a small endeavour around 1600 has become a main trade for many people in this Dolomite valley. In 1994 Unika has been founded and since then it is a known platform for sculpture, painting, turnery and photography by local and regional artists. Unika stands for hand-carved unique pieces and has currently 40 members. The Unika association offers an impressive variety of sculptures and pictures that are as different and individual as their creators themselves. Whether figurative or abstract, profane or sacred, one characteristic unites all works: they are exclusively hand-carved and unique.

The wooden fans, a historical undertaking to sculpt 50 full-size wooden figures, 25 of them are exposed in the finish area of the World Cup races in Val Gardena. A masterpiece that the Unika group achieved brilliantly thanks to their craftsmanship, creativity and collective strength. The fans were honored with the South Tyrol Marketing Award in 2004 and have been exhibited at various major national and international events.



DOLOMITES Val Gardena Südtirol Ski Trophy for the fastest skiing ace on the Saslong

The ski racer who scores the most World Cup points in the two classic races on the Saslong on the last weekend before Christmas can look forward to a special inaugural prize this year. The winner of the DOLOMITES Val Gardena Südtirol Ski Trophy will receive a true-to-original 3D wooden bust, as well as extra prize money of 5,000 Euros and a short vacation in Val Gardena/Gröden.

The Saslong Classic Club has been successfully organizing World Cup races in Alpine skiing since 1969 and also shone as an excellent World Cup host in 1970. So the speed races in Val Gardena/Gröden have long been classics in the ski circuit and are one of the highlights of the whole winter for most athletes. In a constant effort to make the races at the foot of the Sassolungo/Langkofel mountain ever more professional and attractive, the dedicated organizing committee, together with DOLOMITES Val Gardena Marketing, has come up with something new. The DOLOMITES Val Gardena Südtirol Ski Trophy will be awarded for the first time in Val Gardena/Gröden to the racer who scores the most World Cup points in the super-G on Friday, 18 December and the day after in the classic downhill. If two racers are equal on points, the athlete with the better ranking in one of the races will win. If there is also a tie, the better result in the downhill will decide the winner.

"With this initiative, we would like to create a further incentive for the best downhill racers in the world within the framework of our two speed events and award them for top athletic performance in both disciplines. At DOLOMITES Val Gardena Marketing, we immediately received positive feedback with this project. We are happy and grateful to have such a strong and above all sports-enthusiastic partner at our side, who has always supported us with advice and action", emphasizes Rainer Senoner, President of the Saslong Classic Club.

DOLOMITES Val Gardena Marketing is also delighted with the DOLOMITES Val Gardena Südtirol Ski Trophy. "We can always be won over for projects of this kind, because the commitment of the Saslong Classic Club has a positive effect on the DOLOMITES Val Gardena brand. This strengthens it and inevitably brings it closer to our target group - the international ski public. Not only through media



reports, but above all through the winning athlete himself. He shares his joy of winning the DOLOMITES Val Gardena Südtirol Ski Trophy with his followers both immediately after the races on social media and in the summer, when he is again a guest in our beautiful valley as part of a short vacation", say Ezio Prinoth, Ambros Hofer and Christoph Vinatzer of DOLOMITES Val Gardena Marketing.

It's worth noting that the true-to-original 3D wooden bust of the successful racer will be on public display. It can be viewed by all ski enthusiasts in the "Hall of Fame" at the Saslonch Hut. There are also the busts of Kjetil Jansrud, Aleksander Aamodt Kilde and Rasmus Windingstad, who won the Südtirol Ski Trophy in the past years. From 2016 to 2019, this prize was awarded to the athlete who collected the most points at the four South Tyrolean World Cup races in Val Gardena/Gröden and Alta Badia.

Rainer Senoner confirmed as president of the Saslong Classic Club

This year's general meeting of the Saslong Classic Club, organizer of the Alpine World Cup Classics in Val Gardena/Gröden, was held in June to elect a new board of directors. Rainer Senoner was confirmed to lead the Saslong Classic Club for the next four years. The members unanimously elected the 53-year-old from Wolkenstein/Selva as their president in a sign of confidence in his leadership. In addition to Senoner, Marcello Cobelli, Damiano Dell'Osbel, Horst Demetz, Moritz Demetz, Daniela Holzknrecht, Igor Marzola, Manuela Perathoner, Werner Perathoner, Monika Runggaldier and Thomas Wielander will sit on the ten-member board of directors that will steer the fate of the Val Gardena/Gröden World Cup Committee. Meanwhile, the supervisory board consists of Ivo Senoner, Thomas Weissensteiner and Hans Peter Perathoner.



Farewell to Ivo Mahlknecht

Ivo Mahlknecht died in March at the age of 80. He was one of the most successful ski racers in Italy in the 1960s and was crowned national champion ten times. Among the highlights of his career were certainly the participation in the 1964 Olympic Games in Innsbruck and four years later in Grenoble. Mahlknecht also competed in the 1966 World Ski Championships in Portillo, Chile. In the World Cup, the ski pioneer from Val Gardena/Gröden achieved a fifth place each in the downhill races of Wengen and Megève. He achieved his best results in Madonna di Campiglio, where he was on the podium three times in the legendary 3-Tre races before the introduction of the World Cup. Even after his career ended in 1968, Ivo Mahlknecht remained true to skiing. For instance, he was the slalom race director at the 1970 World Championships in Val Gardena/Gröden and the coach of the Italian national team in the 1970s.


Fiat 500 Sella Tour in the sign of the 1970 Ski-WM in Val Gardena/Gröden

Every year in September, fans and collectors of the legendary Fiat 500 meet in Val Gardena/Gröden for an autumnal tour over the most beautiful Dolomite passes. At this year's edition in September, the organizers around President Peter Mussner reviewed the World Ski Championships 50 years ago, when Fiat provided the official World Championship vehicles with the 500 and 124 models. The approximately 70 participating vehicles first drove to the finish area of the Saslong, before the retinue tackled this year's tour. They drove over the Niger Pass, the Karer Pass and the Sella Pass before returning to Wolkenstein/Selva with the classic cars. Once there, the 120 or so participants were taken by the Ciampinoi cable car to the Saslong start area, where Rainer Senoner, President of the Saslong Classic Club, addressed the enthusiastic group. The organizers of the Ski World Cup in Val Gardena/Gröden were the partners of this year's Fiat 500 Sella Tour. After the traditional lunch, the event ended in the afternoon for these car lovers from Germany, Austria, the northern Italian regions and of course from South Tyrol.



Key Sections of the Saslong

Ciampinoi (2249 m)

Local mountain of Selva-Wolkenstein is reachable by the Ciampinoi cable car from Selva-Wolkenstein and Saslong cable car and Sochers chair lift from Ruacia

Spinel (2091 m)

Drop-off right after start of the course. This section has the highest gradient of the entire course (56.9%).

Saut dl Moro (2018 m)

Site of the Moro jump, the first big jump on Saslong. It is named after the Moro meadow

Sochers Walls (1900 m)

Steep section with 55.9% gradient named after the Sochers meadows

Camel humps (1813 m)

Originally known as the "Costa de Gialina" (Gialina Ridge), the humps were renamed Camel Humps by FIS Technical Delegate Sepp Sulzberger. This is the most storied section of Saslong, producing jumps of up to 80m in length and with heights of 4-6m. The humps were first skipped by Uli Spiess (AUT) in 1980 in a legendary long jump

Ciaslat (1720 m)

Named after the Ciaslat meadow, featuring a twisting section with up to 17 smaller and larger corrugated bumps.

Nucia Turn and Finish Schuss (1550 m)

This section is named after the Nucia farm with an up to 51.6% steep turn veering heavily toward the left

Tunnel-Jump

Final jump named after the Saslong Tunnel which runs below the jump. The tunnel is 375m long and part of the newly-built by-pass (2009) to St. Christina.

Ruacia (1410 m)

The finish area is named after a local farm
